# **PART THREE**

#### **Directions Sheet**

**Objective**: In Part 3 you will report the answers to each of your questions to create a concise and thorough overview of your topic.

- You will turn each of your questions into a claim that will then be supported by all the evidence (information gathered while doing research in the library or online).
- Your claim should provide the reader with a clear blueprint as to what your information is.
- You will then write the details of what you found while doing research to support your claim. You will do this for each of your questions.

### **Introduction** (at least one paragraph)

- State and briefly describe your topic
- Tell again what you knew, thought you knew, and what you guessed about your topic before you began research (A review of Part 1).

## **Body** (several paragraphs)

- Organize your information in order by question
- Review what information you found for each question and turn each question into a claim.
- Once you write your claims for each question, begin writing part 3 in the order of your questions in essay format.
- You should strive to have several paragraphs for each question. Remember that your information (research) should support your claim.
- You must have at least two sources per question.
- You must include at least two quotations throughout Part 3.

# **Conclusion** (at least one paragraph)

 Strive to answer this question: Why do you think this topic is important to our understanding of world history? What is the big idea of your topic?
