## PART TWO

**Directions Sheet** 

Part Two is what makes an I-Search paper different than a traditional research paper. In Part Two, you will be asking <u>three questions</u> that you will then go find the answers through extensive research. The goal of Part Two is to ask questions that will guide your research to find specific answers. Your task is to come up with good questions that will eventually lead you to a strong paper. If your questions can be answered with a one sentence answer, or if the question is too simple, then it is not a good question. If you have weak or poor questions then your paper will be weak and poor.

It is important to remember that your research is focused towards answering the questions that you asked and not simply gathering all the information you can find. Think of questions that will give you the "big idea" of your topic. Each question should have multiple paragraph answers.

**Question #1** – This first question of your I-Search paper should contain general information about the society in which your topic is located and how your topic fits into that society. This first question will provide the background information needed to set the stage for when you ask more specific questions in questions 2 and 3.

- **Example (People)**: <u>What</u> was European society like in the Middle Ages? <u>Who</u> was Marco Polo <u>what</u> did he do that made him famous?
- Example (Cities / Places): <u>Who</u> were the Aztecs and <u>where</u> was Tenochtitlan? W<u>hat</u> made this city unique?
- Example (Professions): <u>How</u> was Japanese medieval society organized and <u>what</u> was the role samurai played in feudal Japan?
- **Example (Religions):** <u>What</u> are the fundamental principles of the religion of Islam? <u>How</u> did this religion begin and <u>what</u> are some of the main people associated with this religion?
- **Example (Events):** <u>What</u> was European society like in the Middle Ages? <u>What</u> was the Black Death and <u>when</u> and <u>where</u> did it occur during the Middle Ages?
- Example (General): <u>How</u> was society in medieval Europe organized and <u>how</u> was warfare a part of that society? <u>What</u> were some of the weapons used in medieval Europe?
- **Example: (General):** <u>What</u> was West African society like in the Middle Ages? <u>What</u> were some of the common foods eaten in West Africa and <u>how</u> were they prepared?

**Questions #2 - #3**– The rest of your questions should deal with such things as:

- Impact on society
- Change over time
- Comparison to other topics that are similar
- Different points of view
- Cause and effect
  - **Example**: How is Michelangelo's art both <u>similar</u> and <u>different</u> to other Renaissance artists such as Leonardo da Vinci and Raphael?
  - **Example**: What <u>impact</u> did Hernan Cortes have on the lives of the Aztec people?
  - **Example**: How was food of the Americas <u>similar</u> and <u>different</u> to food of Asia during the Middle Ages?
  - **Example**: How did weapons in medieval Asia <u>change over time</u> and what <u>impact</u> did these changes have on society?
  - **Example**: How was Kublai Khan viewed <u>differently</u> by both the Mongols and the Chinese (<u>different points of view</u>)?
  - **Example**: How did the Black Death (<u>cause</u>) impact European society to change (effect) in the Middle Ages?
  - **Example**: How is Buddhism <u>similar</u> and <u>different</u> today then it was in Asia during the Middle Ages?
  - **Example**: What were some major Arab scientific inventions in the Middle Ages and how have they <u>impacted</u> the world?

## Examples of Bad questions:

- Example: What was their clothing like?
- Example: Was Joan of Arc married?
- Example: How did Genghis Khan die?
- **Example:** Who invented medicine in Asia?
- **Example:** What was the best castle ever built?
- **Example:** Who built the Eiffel Tower in medieval Paris?
