

PART 5 The Bibliography

A bibliography is a list of sources (books, encyclopedias, internet web sites, etc.) that you used to complete your I-Search paper. It is located at the end of the research paper (part 5). An easy way to do your works cited (bibliography) is to go to www.easybib.com and plug in your information. Watch the YouTube tutorial in the I-Search section on the lacolinawalk website for help.

- Entries are listed **alphabetically** in order of the author's last name.
- If no **author**, the first word of the title is used to determine the order.
- Separate author, title, and publication information with a period followed by one space.
- Each entry is **single-spaced**.
- **Double-space** is used between entries.
- The second and subsequent lines are **indented five (5) spaces**.
- Each entry **ends with a period (.)**.

Encyclopedia article with an author	Fonseca, Carlos. "Leonardo da Vinci." <u>World Book Encyclopedia</u> . 1988.
Encyclopedia article with no author	"El Nino." <u>Academic American Encyclopedia</u> . 1999.
